## **Brief Report**

The five men preach, teach, and lead singing.

They are assisted by other men of the congregation who also preach, teach, lead singing, and direct services. None receives financial support from the church. There is no staff in addition to them.

"Let the elders who rule well be considered worthy of double honor, especially those who labor in preaching and teaching..." 1 Timothy 5:17-18









Alfonso Estrella Sánchez, elder, preaches, Sunday, Jan. 17, 2021, on the subject "God's Discipline and Self-Discipline."

We also honor men of the Bayamon, Puerto Rico who preach, teach, and lead singing but for one or another circumstance do not yet fully qualify to be elders or deacons.

Wilfredo Pérez preaches Feb. 21, 2021, in Bayamon, on the subject "Are You Really Wise?" A little more than three years ago, Wilfredo began preaching some for a small congregation in Manatí, Puerto Rico, at the encouragement and with the guidance of his father-in-law, Luis Sardina, elder. Both Luis and his wife, Myrna, and Wilfredo and his wife, Myrna Liz, with their two sons, have been helping that congregation for several years.

Heard throughout the island, this program is a special blessing during this critical Time of the Coronavirus Pandemic.

The preaching brethren of Bayamon frequently take turns speaking in other congregations, and some from sister congregations are invited to preach in Bayamon.

This means the members of the congregations do not have to listen to the same preacher every Sunday! Cutting way back on being exposed to repetitious

content and the same pulpit style every Sunday, even for years and years. It enables preachers to devote more time to sermon preparation and is an incentive for them to do their best.

In Puerto Rico, when a brother preaches in a sister congregation, he does not expect to be paid for it. Of course, 1 Timothy 5:17-18 specifically authorizes **material support** for **elders** "**who labor** in **preaching** and **teaching**" should they need it. If the circumstances of a congregation are of such a nature that a supported elder-shepherd is needed, or more than one, because of the number of sheep, extensive benevolent and/or evangelistic outreaches, etc., clear authorization is legislated in the text cited.


Knowing all of them well and for decades, I estimate that the Bayamon preaching brethren presented in this report would have, summing up the years each has been a faithful Christian, a total of about 300 years in the church.

While some might consider me naturally biased, having worked with these eight Bayamon preaching and teaching brethren for so long, my opinion is, understanding Spanish as I do, that the content, quality, variety, depth, timeliness, and presentation of their sermons and classes is equal to, and, in some cases, superior to, most of what I have heard in English. Well, so I may be a little prejudiced!

By the way, since some congregations in Puerto Rico with elders and deacons, or a capable leadership according to the guidelines of 1 Corinthians 16:15-16, have elected not to bring in a full-time, paid preacher to take care of the sheep, their contributions have been used to build their own meeting places and support local evangelistic and benevolent works, plus extensive works of that same kind, particularly in the Dominican Republic and El Salvador; to a lesser degree in Venezuela, Haiti and India. Having much knowledge of works done and funds invested over a period of 50 years, I would state the total at several million dollars. An imprecise figure to be sure, but to give an idea.


